


# MOVIE AT PALACE BRIGHTON BAY THEATRE ...... with Estelle McNamara Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> August

## LIVE THEATRE ---- with John Wilson


Thursday 5th September at 8.00pm at the Malvern Theatre Company, 29 Burke Road, Malvern East.
